Re: Fall 2006 Graduate Program Profiles

The Fall 2006 Graduate Program Profiles report should be useful as you consider your program's strengths, plan recruitment efforts, and manage enrollments.

This report reflects the actual number of students enrolled at the Fall 2006 census date. This figure differs from the official number that is reported to SCHEV by the Office of Institutional Research. The discrepancy is caused by the fact that while this report counts auditing<sup>1</sup> and fee waiver<sup>2</sup> students, the official number cannot include those students. Nevertheless, this report reflects all students that are enrolled in a graduate level class for Fall 2006 at census.

All figures throughout this report (except where noted) reflect data for the Fall term only. One notable exception is the data for graduate degree conferrals, which reflect the academic year from the fall term to the summer term of the next calendar year. For example, the data under "2004-2005" represents degrees awarded from Fall 2004 through Summer 2005.

<sup>1</sup> An auditing student is one whose only class is an audit course.

<sup>2</sup> A fee waiver student is an employee whose only class has its tuition and fees waived.
