Re: Fall 2008 Graduate Program Profiles

We are happy to provide to the RU community the Fall 2008 Graduate Program Profiles report. We hope that it provides valuable information in looking at our graduate programs both across programs at any year and within programs over the years. With the RU 7-17 Strategic Plan calling for more and better graduate students and programs, this report provides a baseline from which we can measure our progress in the years ahead.

This report reflects the actual number of students enrolled at the Fall 2008 census date reported by the Office of Institutional Research to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV). These numbers may differ slightly from the actual number of students enrolled in any one program (+/- 1-3 students) since they do not include auditing or non-paying attendees.

All figures throughout this report (except where noted) reflect data for the Fall term only. One notable exception is the data for graduate degree conferrals, which reflect the academic year from the fall term to the summer term of the next calendar year. For example, the data under "2004-2005" represents degrees awarded from Fall 2004 through Summer 2005.

I would like to recognize and thank, Dr. Debra Templeton and her excellent staff in the Office of Institutional Research and Mr. Andrew Luther our capable Graduate Assistant who together provided the bulk of the work getting this report assembled.
